Changing requirements of the Food Supply Chain

Session Two

Is the UK Prepared? Biosecurity for plants and animals

After a PhD at the Plant Breeding Institute in Cambridge and a postdoc at Harvard, JJ worked 1983-8 at an early US agbiotech company, AGS. At the Sainsbury Lab (TSL) on the JIC site in Norwich since 1988, he is a leading researcher in plant disease resistance. His lab works on plant immune receptor mechanisms, their diversity and their deployment.

The recent Genetic Technologies (Precision Breeding) Act is enabling his team to develop precision bred potato varieties that are resistant to late blight and to two important viruses (PVY and PLRV).

He is an outspoken advocate of modern genetic solutions to crop disease problems and led a recent policy briefing. He co-founded and is a Director of norfolkplantsciences.com and norfolkhealthyproduce.com that brings engineered purple tomatoes to market and is also a Director of BioPotatoes.com. JJ was elected Fellow of the Royal Society in 2003, an international member of US National Academy of Sciences in 2015 and a DL for Norfolk in 2023.

Séan Henry Rickard Economist

A professional economist with expertise in policy and forecasting, Sean Henry Rickard served as Chief Economist for the National Farmers Union from 1987 to 1995 before transitioning to academia, where he specialized in the economics of strategy at Cranfield School of Management and directed MBA programmes from 1995 to 2012.

During this period, he also acted as a government academic adviser on food and agricultural policy. Currently he leads his own consultancy, producing economic reports, forecasts and strategies for the agri-food sector.

A visiting lecturer and research fellow at the Royal Institution, he also chairs First Milk's Members' Council and is the author of The Economics of Organisations and Strategy (McGraw-Hill).

Session Three

Mapping the Landscape - Auditing the land for food production and the environment

Raised on a family farm in South Lincolnshire, Peter studied Agribusiness Management at Wye College before returning home to specialise in potato and daffodil production alongside nature.

In 2018, attending the Worshipful Company of Farmers' Advanced Agri-Business Management Course was transformative, leading him to leadership roles, including the NFU Potato Policy Group, the OFC Emerging Leaders Programme and earning a Nuffield Farming Scholarship. After completing the IAgrM Leadership Programme last year, Peter joined Natural England as Head of Agriculture.

Charles Godfray is a population biologist with broad interests in science and the interplay of science and policy. He has spent his career at Oxford University and Imperial College London and is currently Professor of Population Biology and Director of the Oxford Martin School at Oxford.

His research has involved experimental and theoretical studies in population and community ecology, epidemiology and evolutionary biology.

Currently he is working on the control of malaria vectoring mosquitoes using novel genetic interventions, the health, environmental and economic consequences of changing patterns of food consumption and UK land-use policy. He is particularly interested in food security and chaired the Lead Expert Group of the UK Government Office of Science's Foresight project on the Future of Food and Farming and until recently chaired Defra's Science Advisory Council.

Diana has spent the last 12 years with Frontier Agriculture, promoted to Group Finance Director in July 2017, before becoming the Deputy Managing Director in April 2024 and moving into the Group Managing Director role with effect from January 2025.

Case Study

Archie Ruggles-Brise Spains Hall Estate Land Management Vision

Archie is a 2025 Nuffield Farming Scholar exploring the title "Balancing the Books. Does Multifunctional productivity represent optimal land use?"

Archie's scholarship is generously sponsored by the Royal Norfolk Agricultural Association.

When not travelling Archie manages the day to day running of Spains Hall Estate's 860 hectares of ancient woodland, grassland, tenanted farms, nut agroforestry and beaver and natural flood management project in Essex.

He masterminded the reintroduction of beavers into a fenced enclosure in 2019 to combat village flooding – the first project of its type in East Anglia. Since then, he has designed and delivered the largest nut agroforestry scheme in Europe, and pioneered an holistic impact appraisal for on farm water called the 'Whole Farm Reservoir.'

Archie's external engagements including working with other organisations to explore new sustainable land use projects, enviro-tech and strategic approaches to multifunctional land use. He currently consults for Zulu Ecosystems and AtkinsRéalis. He is a trustee of the Essex and Suffolk Rivers Trust, Director of the North Essex Farm Cluster, a member of the CLA's Forestry and Natural Capital Committee and adviser to both the Essex Climate Action Commission and Essex Local Nature Partnership.
